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Common COVID-19 Questions

Isolation/Quarantine

What dates do I isolate/quarantine from?

You isolate/quarantine from either the day your symptoms started or from the day you tested positive for covid-19 (if you are having no symptoms). The length of quarantine is 5 days but continue to wear a mask when around others until day 10. If you are having symptoms past the five day mark, you need to continue to stay in isolation until day 10 or until symptoms improve. People under the age of 2 who have tested positive need to isolate for 10 days, since they are unable to wear a mask.

If you have been exposed to someone who tested positive and are unvaccinated, you would quarantine for 5 days from the day you were last in contact with that person (even if you are not having symptoms) and are not testing positive. If you are fully vaccinated or up to date and not having any symptoms, you would not need to quarantine.

What should I do if my employer will not pay me for the time I missed from having COVID-19?

Call the Department of Labor at (518) 457-9000 and explain the situation you are in. The DOL will be able to assist you.



If I am in quarantine and a family member becomes positive, does my quarantine need to be extended?

Your quarantine would be extended if you were exposed to that other person in the household that tested positive and are not vaccinated or up to date on your booster shot.

I recently had COVID-19 and have tested positive again on a PCR test or an at home test. What do I do now?

First, if you tested positive within 90 days of your first positive result you do not have to quarantine again, unless you are not having symptoms. If you are having symptoms, then you should quarantine again for 5 days.

Second, go to the Tioga County or New York State Department of Health website where you can fill out an Isolation & Quarantine Documentation Form. There are forms for a PCR test and an at home test.

Vaccination

When can I get a covid-19 vaccine after having COVID-19?

Once your isolation ends, you should be able to get the vaccine. There is no time frame you would have to wait once you have completed your quarantine. However, you will have natural immunity for at least 90 days. Consult with your primary care provider and get their thoughts on this question as well.

How long do I have to wait between vaccine doses?

Pfizer: For the Pfizer vaccine you have to wait 3 weeks between doses.

<u>Moderna</u>: For the Moderna vaccine you have to wait 4 weeks between doses.

Johnson & Johnson (J&J): For the J&J vaccine it is just one dose.



How long do I have to wait until I can get a booster shot?

For Pfizer and Moderna you can get a booster shot 5 months after your second vaccine dose. For the J&J booster you can get it after 2 months of the first and only dose.

When am I fully vaccinated?

You are considered fully vaccinated two weeks after receiving either 2 doses of Pfizer/Moderna or 1 dose of Johnson & Johnson. If eligible for a booster, you are considered up to date on vaccinations 2 weeks after booster.

Fully Vaccinated: A person has received their primary series of COVID-19 vaccines.

Up to date: A person who has received all recommended COVID-19 vaccines, including any booster dose(s) when eligible.

Where can I go to get a vaccine?

Many pharmacies and most primary care providers provide vaccines. You can use this link to find a vaccine location near you by typing in your zip code and picking which vaccine you would like to get (Pfizer, Moderna, or Johnson & Johnson). Children between the ages of 5-11 can only get the Pfizer vaccine: https://www.vaccines.gov/search/

Immunity: Protection from an infectious disease. If you are immune to a disease, you can be exposed to it without becoming infected.

Immunization: A process by which a person becomes protected against a disease through vaccination. This term is often used interchangeably with vaccination or inoculation.

Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) – assistance for individuals who are homeless or facing eviction and not eligible for the usual TA programs (Contact Tioga Employment Center – (607) 687-8500).

Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP) – assistance for individuals who have rental and utility arrears. This program is administered by the State. (Tioga Employment Center providing assistance to landlords and tenants to apply). https://otda.ny.gov/programs/emergency-rental-assistance/

HEAP Regular Arrears Supplement (RAS) – a one-time additional Regular HEAP benefit to assist with electric and/or natural gas arrearages (**No application needed** – eligibility considered for each HEAP applicant). SNAP Emergency allotments – ensures that all households eligible for SNAP receive the maximum benefit amount for their household size (*No application* – *Supplements processed by the State each month*).(607) 687-8300 https://tiogacountyny.com/departments/social-services/

Low-Income Household Water Assistance Program – a one-time benefit to assist with water and/or sewer arrears. <u>https://otda.ny.gov/programs/water-assistance</u>

Pandemic Emergency Assistance Program (PEAF) – a one-time benefit to assist with the cost of diapers for children under three, as well as food assistance for multi-generational households. **No application** – benefit to be provided by the State in February (diapers) and April (food assistance) for TA and SNAP recipient households (607) 687-8300

COVID-19 Testing Locations

A PCR test is usually the most accurate test to take and you get your results in 24-48 hours. A rapid test is accurate but not as accurate as the PCR test because you get your results back within 15 minutes of taking the test. The at home test is the least accurate of the three tests. This test you buy from a store or order online. You take your own sample and get results quickly.

Eviction Information

As of January 16, 2022, the Moratorium on Covid-related Residential and Commercial Evictions has expired. The Governor and Legislature are exploring pathways to assist owners and tenants. Please note:

- In New York State, an eviction of a tenant is lawful only if an owner has brought a court proceeding and obtained a judgment of possession from the court.
- Only a sheriff, marshal, or constable can carry out a court-ordered eviction. Property owners and landlords may not evict a tenant by use of force or unlawful means.
- Any tenant who believes they are about to be evicted should contact an attorney in a private practice or with a legal aid or legal services agency to protect their interests.

Amazon Prime Changes

If you didn't already know, folks receiving certain types of assistance qualify for a discounted rate for an Amazon Prime Membership. If you receive SNAP, WIC, TANF or other assistance- you may qualify for the discounted rate. Currently Amazon is charging \$139 for a yearly subscription with no discount.

Emergency Broadband Benefit Changes

This benefit was offered to help offset the costs of internet during COVIDqualifying household were able to receive a discount on their monthly rate (up to \$50/month). As of 12/31/21 the Affordable Connectivity Program replaced the Emergency Broadband Benefit, which offers a \$30 credit to internet.
